## OBJECTIVES

The objective of the Peer Review of the Danish Research and Innovation system is to assess how Denmark can adjust its efforts to enhance knowledge-based innovation based on international best practice and to provide concrete recommendations for a future development of public policy efforts in this field.

## SCOPE

The Peer review will examine the Danish knowledge-based innovation system as a whole, including the value chain from research to innovation in established and new companies. It will start with an assessment of the current situation, notably in relation to the three following focus areas:

- Knowledge-based technological services for business
- Collaboration, networking and matchmaking
- Knowledge-based entrepreneurship

The Peer Review will draw upon the conclusions of the parallel evaluation of the Innovation Fund Denmark and the review of the universities' technology transfer activities – both of which are initiatives reflecting the government's research and innovation strategy.

Some international examples of successful public policy efforts related to knowledge-based innovation ("good practices") will be outlined in the final report. The panel will formulate its recommendations based on the assessment of the current state-of-play in the Danish knowledge-based innovation system and taking stock of the international good practice.
